

SET YOUR SIGHTS FOR PANAMA!

out your passport and check its expiration date...DCAS is heading for Panama! We are working with www.birdingpanama.com to set up our own customized tour. As of this writing, we would have three nights in Panama city at the Albrook Inn, birding the Metropolitan Nature Park, Pipeline Road and Discovery Center Tower, the Old Gamboa Road and Plantation Road; then two nights at the Sierra Llorona Lodge on the Caribbean Slope, birding the Achiote Road and the slopes of Sierra Llorona; two nights at the Ginger House In the Cerro Azul foothills and the Chagres National Park. We are looking at flying into Panama City on January 3rd or 4th and returning on January 11th. Cost for the trip should come in at about \$2000...\$1200 to Birding Panama for room, meals and guided birding trips and about \$800 for airfare from Evansville.
